Regarding Practice Records:

Students have been required to supply records of their practice during the week. The use of practice records will cease as of right now. Students are invited to continue using them for their own benefit, however, they are not needed for a grade. Regarding Assessments:

Students are regularly assessed in band classes. These assessments happen in a variety of ways: playing tests ensure the student is able to perform music we are working on while giving opportunity for individual feedback; written tests allow the students to show mastery in a written form. All tests are available for retakes. To show mastery, a student must receive an 80% or higher. They have until the last week of the quarter to schedule a time (12-12:30pm; 8-8:30am) for retake. It is their responsibility to schedule this time.
